**Subject** Minutes of the 28<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Steering Committee of National Institutes of Pharmaceutical Education & Research (NIPERs) of Ahmedabad, Guwahati, Hajipur, Hyderabad, Kolkata and Rae Bareli.

The 28<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Steering Committee was held under the chairmanship of Secretary, Pharmaceuticals on 10.07.2017 at 11.00 am. The List of participants is at **Annexure**.

2. At the outset, Joint Secretary (RT) welcomed all the participants.
3. The issue regarding income generated by NIPERs from various sources *vis a vis* recurring expenses on various accounts was discussed and Secretary (Pharma) desired to know the following information NIPER-wise:

**Income:**


- i. Fee receipts - Semester-wise for M(Pharma), MBA(Pharma) & PhD separately for last 6 semesters, semester-wise
- ii. Earnings from Consultancy, Projects, etc. for last 3 years, academic year-wise
- iii. Earning from laboratory/ testing charges etc. for last 3 years, academic year-wise
- iv. Any other income for last 3 years, academic year-wise

**Operational Expenditure:**


- i. Salary paid - separately for faculty and administrative staff for last 3 years, academic year-wise
- ii. Stipend paid (separately for Master's and PhD students) for last 3 years, academic year-wise
- iii. Recurring expenditure on account of laboratory consumables etc. for last 3 years, academic year-wise
- iv. Expenditure on Hostel facility for last 3 years, academic year-wise
- v. Expenditure on transport facilities provided to the students for last 3 years, academic year-wise

**(Action: All NIPERs)**

4. It was stressed by Secretary (Pharma) that the Government cannot continue to fund the Institutes indefinitely and they have to generate their own resources. Henceforth, only a part of the expenditure on salaries would be reimbursed and the remaining need to be earned by the faculty itself from consultancy, projects etc. Each NIPER will work out and submit a proposal about their contribution to raising resources. **(Action: All NIPERs)**
5. Each NIPER will work out and submit a proposal for generation of resources so as to make the Institutes self-reliant, as far as possible. **(Action: All NIPERs)**
6. NIPERs should explore to start undergraduate courses, integrated courses etc. for optimum utilization of their existing facilities and to cross-subsidise the Masters' and PhD programmes. All NIPERs should jointly examine the issue thoroughly together with the Pharmacy Council and submit a detailed report to the Department at the earliest. **(Action: All NIPERs)**
7. The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the Chair.
